Timo Sarpaneva originally designed the i-logo used by Iittala for a series of glasses called the I-glass.




Royal Copenhagen was founded in 1775 by a Queen - **Juliane Marie** Queen of Denmark.



Blue Fluted Plain is Royal Copenhagen's first design, dating from 1775. To this day, each piece of Blue Fluted Plain has a "1" painted underneath.



Gerber has sold over 1 million Gator folders.



The three hand-painted waves Royal Copenhagen stamp symbolise Denmark's waterways, the 'Oresund' or Sound, the Great Belt and the Little Belt.



The original Danish name for Royal Copenhagen's Blue Fluted Plain is "Musselmalet" or clam-painted. Some believe this is because the fluted shape is reminiscent of a clam- or seashell, but it is in fact based on a stylised chrysanthemum and cinquefoil motif.
